215 heritage sites and circuits to discover on September 8, 9, and 10 2023

Montréal, August 28 2023 — The Québec Religious Heritage Council (CPRQ) is thrilled to announce that the activities for this year's Religious Heritage Days are now available for consultation on the event's website, journeesdupatrimoinereligieux.ca. With 215 sites and circuits to discover, from Gatineau to the Îles-de-la-Madeleine passing through Rouyn-Noranda in Abitibi-Témiscamingue, there's surely something on offer to pique your curiosity!

Just like every year, participation in the event is on a voluntary basis, according to the capacity of the site to welcome visitors. Activities—tours, concerts, conferences, exhibitions and guided circuits—are offered free of charge, but participants can demonstrate their appreciation by leaving a donation onsite to support initiatives to preserve the sites and keep them open.

In parallel with these numerous activities, part of the Quebec Religious Heritage Council's team, joined by a delegation from Louisiana made up of the founders of the Nous Foundation and the director of the *West Baton Rouge Museum* will be participating in several activities of the Religious Heritage Days in the scope of a bilateral cooperation grant between Québec and Louisiana through the Ministry of International Relations and the French Language

In total, 6 sites and circuits in the region have registered activities for the event : the Church of Our Lady of Sorrows, the Church of Saint-André-Avellin, the Church of Sainte-Angélique, the Church of Saint-François-de-Sales, St-Stephen's Parish as well as the circuit of greater Gatineau. Concerts, tours, onsite sessions with artists and painters; discover the sites that await you and the stories they have to tell.
